In Spanish, the article you use depends on the gender of the noun that follows it.

Definite article

(equivalent to English "the")

Use when you are talking about a specific noun or group of nouns.

el (masculine, singular)
la (feminine, singular)
los (masculine, plural)
las (feminine, plural)

Indefinite article

(equivalent to English "a," "an," or "some")

Use when you are not talking about a specific noun or group of nouns.

un (masculine, singular)
una (feminine, singular)
unos (masculine, plural)
unas (feminine, plural)
